We have reduced our class sizes to a point where each student is approximately 10 feet away. Social distancing is enforced, masks are required at all times during class, in public spaces, and we have no lunch period.

Our elective classes follow the same cohort model to allow for a maximum amount of distance. In addition, a stringent cleaning/disinfecting program is in place to disinfect rooms, equipment, and tools between classes.
