Graduation Ceremony 2023

Congratulations to our 2023 graduates!

Graduation is a very special event for us all. The following guidelines outline a few of the traditions and expectations which accompany this ceremony that culminates your years of achievement in high school. Graduation will be held at the Sutter High School football stadium on Friday, June 2, 2023 at 7:30 pm. Seniors need to report to the South Gym NO LATER than 6:45 pm.

All students must report to the gym **ON TIME**. Doors to the gym will be closed and locked at the start time. **Wednesday, May 31st, 2023: 9:00-11:00 am**

Dress Expectations

We want our students to dress appropriately for the formal graduation ceremony that exemplifies the character of the senior class, their parents, and our school. All students are to wear professional business attire appropriate for the occasion. Boys are to wear nice slacks, dress shirt and tie, and dress shoes. Girls are to wear dresses or skirts with dressy footwear. Platforms or wedges are best. Spiked heels are not appropriate as we will be walking in the grass. **NO SHORTS, FLIP-FLOPS, TENNIS SHOES OR JEANS!!** Steam gowns using low to medium settings to remove wrinkles. **DO NOT ALTER YOUR CAP OR GOWN IN ANY WAY!** The only items permitted are honor cords and flower leis. Any other leis must be approved by administration. You will be removed from the ceremony if you fail to comply.

Supplemental Materials

Do not bring any supplemental materials into the ceremony. This includes, but is not limited to: balls, balloons, cell phones, sunglasses, signs, noisemakers, chains or any other materials or apparel that might detract from the ceremony and the honor bestowed on each graduating student. Do not letter/decorate any part of graduation caps. If a student needs to be escorted out during the ceremony because of improper conduct, it detracts from the dignity of the graduation ceremony.

Pictures

During the ceremony an individual picture will be taken of each student as they receive their diploma on stage as well as a class picture during practice. Picture package information will be distributed during practices.
