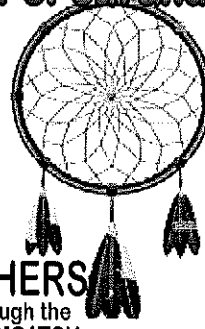

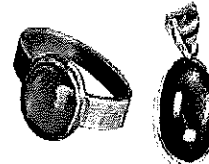
Silversmithing Part 1
